# Grand Knights Report

My Brother Knights:  
Vivat Jesus!



In my previous two reports, I spoke to you about Charity and Unity – the first two principles of our order. For this report, I would like to speak on the principle of Fraternity. When I first reflected on the word fraternity, it brought me back to my college days. I’m sure for many of us; this word conjures up images of college-aged men in pursuit of high literary and educational endeavors! (Yeah, right)

Despite the rather poor association, the word fraternity has a much deeper meaning to our order. One definition defines it as an organization of laymen for religious or charitable purposes, but I prefer to consider the definition: **the quality of being brotherly.**

Brotherhood is the attribute that binds us all together. Most of us are not brothers because of a familial bond, but rather we are brothers by choice! We choose to associate and form strong friendships with each other. As these friendships grow, we share our life experiences with each other. In events such as weddings, the birth of children, first communion celebrations, and graduations we invite those people who are closest to us a share in our happiness – and in many instances, this includes our brother knights.

But we also share with our brothers during the more difficult times in our lives. Whether in the loss of a job, the loss of a loved one, or some other catastrophic event, we join together to shore up our brothers and help them endure the hard times. This support not only extends to a brother knight, but to his family as well. The Venerable Michael J. McGivney founded the Knights of Columbus, in large part, to provide assistance to the widows and children left behind when the family breadwinner died – often prematurely. In the Knights of Columbus, we watch out for and take care of one another.

While it’s important that we share the highs and lows of our lives with each other, I believe that the most valuable times that we express our “brotherhood” is in the everyday events that we share together. For me, I’ve found great value in joining with my brothers during our “after meeting” socials, praying a rosary with other brothers to end abortion, gathering at a brother’s home to enjoy dinner or to watch the Super Bowl, joining with a brother to sing karaoke at our corn roast, and especially the fellowship that I share with my brothers while on retreat! These are the times that the friendships we make go beyond mere casual acquaintances. In these times, brothers are bonded together and in these times, fraternity is shared.

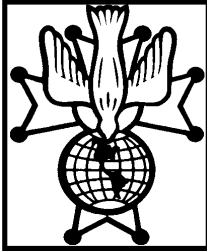

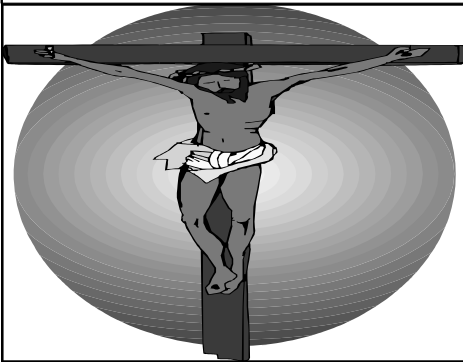

## Jesus Lives!

*This article originally appeared in Columbia magazine August 2005 and is reprinted here with permission from the Knights of Columbus, New Haven, Conn*

The words *Vivat Jesus!* are much more than a slogan or password for the Knights of Columbus. In these words, “Jesus lives!” we find the foundation, meaning and mission of our Order. When Pope Benedict XVI spoke for the first time in the homily at his installation Mass, he said, “The Church is alive – she is alive because Christ is alive, because he is truly risen.” It is this reality of the Risen One that animates the work of the Knights of Columbus and why we greet each other fraternally with “*Vivat Jesus!*”

In his first homily as supreme chaplain at the state deputies’ meeting last June in New Haven, Bishop William E. Lori spoke about the necessity of the earthen vessels of our lives manifesting the glory of the Lord. That, too, is the mission of the Knights of Columbus. As Benedict XVI reminded us at his installation, “the purpose of our lives is to reveal God to men.”

Our Order, perhaps more than any other organization of Catholic laymen, is called to witness to a world that is unbelieving, that is doubtful, that is cynical, and that in many regions has abandoned the Christian faith. This witness comes primarily through our works of charity, through our families, and through the spirit of fraternity that animates our organization; it is a witness that proclaims Jesus is truly alive and so is his Church.

The real “culture war” that we face is the insistence of secular society that Jesus is merely a 2,000-year-old historical fact that can be ignored today. Secular society’s insistence upon legalized abortion, euthanasia and same-sex “marriage” is, in reality, the symptom of this fundamental refusal to see Jesus in his full reality.

Through our works of charity, the Lord’s presence is made manifest, in so many ways, in our parishes, our neighborhoods and our families. This is why Charity remains the first and animating principle of our Order.

This is also why we continue to focus so strongly on charity and why we are so proud that our Survey of Fraternal Activity this year again shows the Knights of Columbus growing in works of charity – nearly \$136 million and more than 63 million hours in volunteer service.

With an average of \$17 for each volunteer hour, that equates to more than \$1 billion in service last year alone, and more than \$10 billion during the last decade. And in direct cash payments in the last decade we have exceeded \$1 billion.

The real importance of this is not simply a matter of dollars. The real importance is that our councils have an open door and a helping hand for so many neighbors in need.

This month we will celebrate our third Knights of Columbus Eucharistic Congress – a very special event during the Year of the Eucharist. Its theme highlights our principles of charity and unity.

As Catholics our works of charity are rooted in the divine act of charity revealed in the Eucharist, the Eucharist that is also the source of our unity. The Eucharist is our sublime assurance that Jesus lives and that he is with us! *Vivat Jesus!*

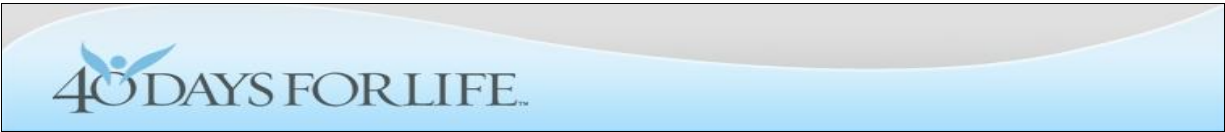

## **What is 40 Day for Life?**

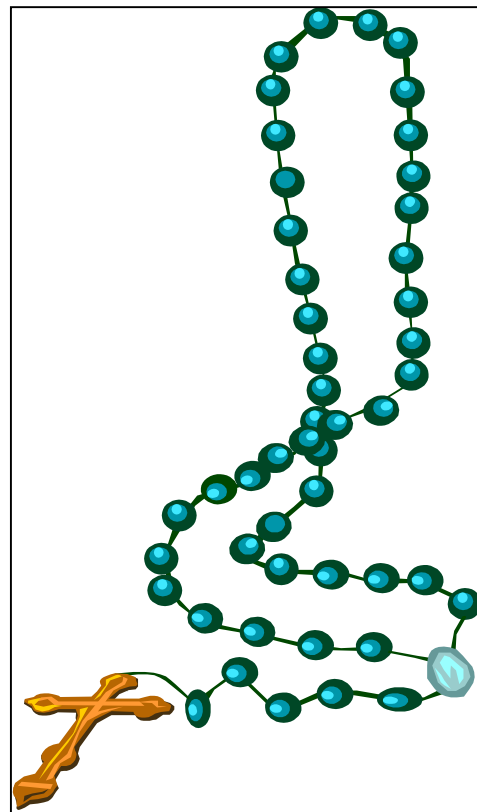
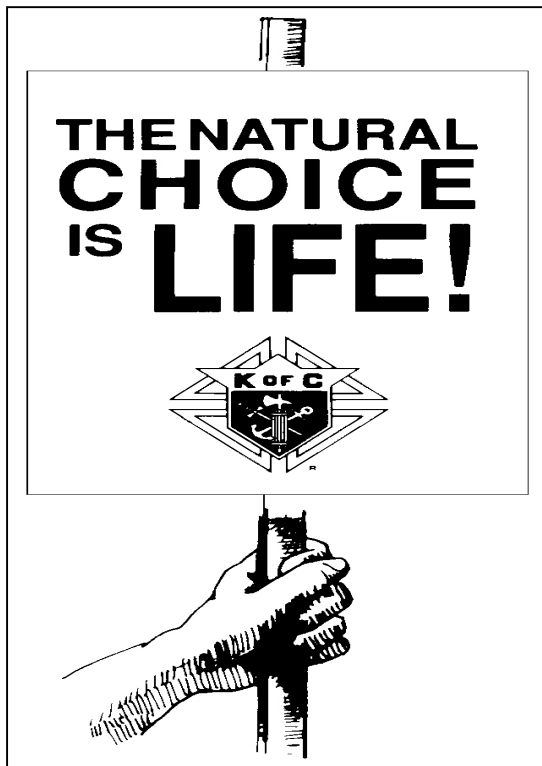

## Prayer Asking the Intercession of St. Joseph the Worker

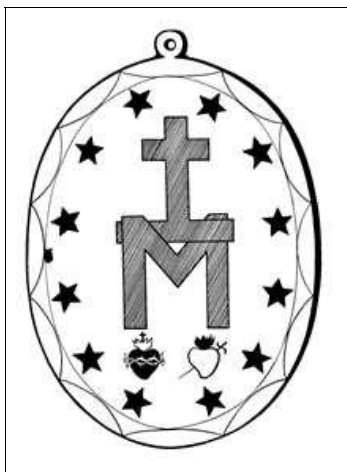
Oh glorious Joseph, who concealed your incomparable and regal dignity of custodian of Jesus and the Virgin Mary under the humble appearance of a craftsman and provided for them with your work, protect with loving power your children, especially entrusted to you. You know their anxieties and sufferings, because you yourself experienced them at the side of Jesus and His Mother. Do not allow them, oppressed by so many worries, to forget the purpose for which they were created by God. Do not allow the seeds of distrust to take hold of their immortal souls. Remind all the workers that in the fields, and factories, and mines, and scientific laboratories, they are not working, rejoicing, or suffering alone, but at their side is Jesus, with Mary, His Mother and ours, to sustain them, to dry the seat of their brow, giving value to their toil. Teach them to turn work into a very high instrument of sanctification as you did, Amen.

### The meaning of the front side of the Miraculous Medal



Mary is standing upon a globe, as the queen of heaven and earth, crushing the head of a serpent beneath her feet. By crushing the serpent she is proclaiming Satan and all of his followers are helpless before her (Genesis 3:15). The year 1830 on the Miraculous Medal is the year the Blessed Mother gave the design of the Miraculous Medal to St. Catherine Laboure. The reference to Mary conceived without sin supports the dogma of the Immaculate Conception of Mary—not to be confused with the virgin birth of Jesus, and referring to Mary’s sinlessness, “full of grace” and “blessed among women” (Luke 1:28)- that was proclaimed 24 years later in 1854.

### The meaning of the back side of the Miraculous Medal



The 12 stars represent the Apostles, who represent the entire Church as it surrounds Mary. They also recall the vision of St. John (12:1), in which “a great sign appeared in heaven, and a woman clothed with the sun, and the moon under her feet, and on her head a crown of 12 stars”. The cross can symbolize Christ and our redemption, with the bar under the cross a sign of the earth. The “M” stands for Mary, and the interleaving of her initial on the cross, shows Mary close involvement with Jesus and our world. The two hearts represent the love of Jesus and Mary for us.
